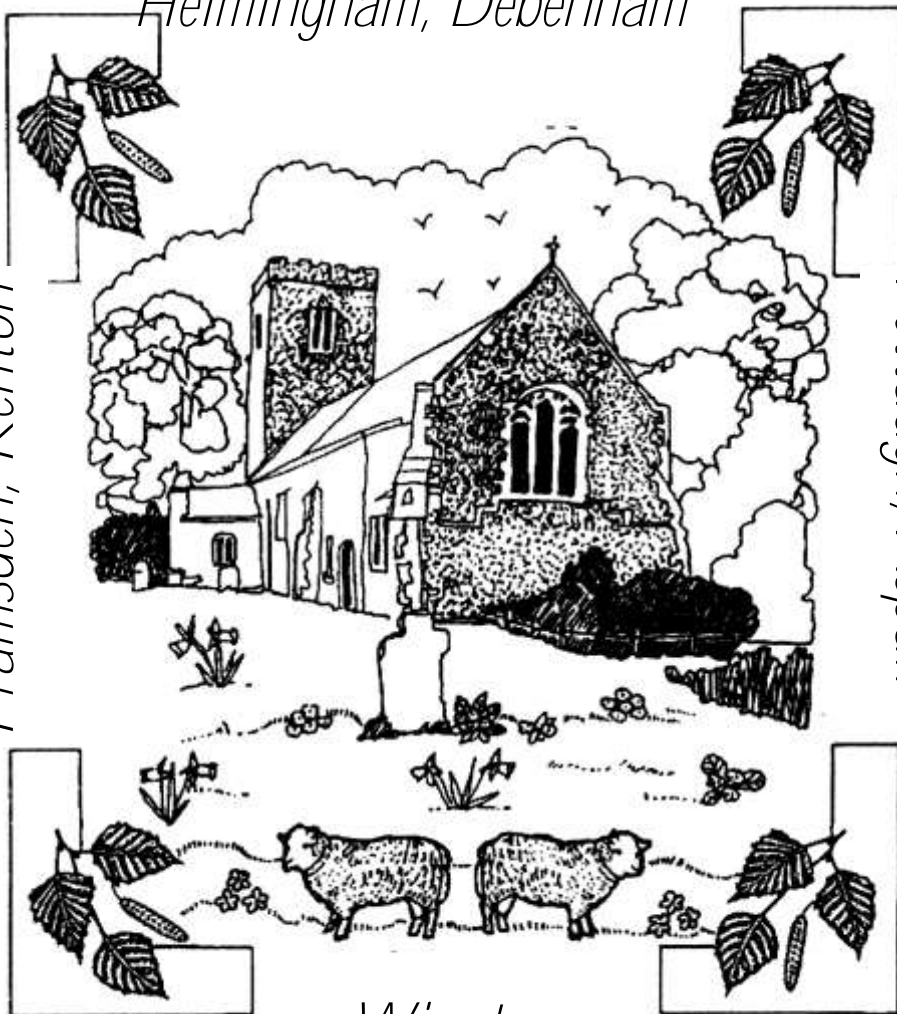

From the Vicarage: Spring 2014

“Why do you need to go to church?” a regular attender was asked by their [non-attending] spouse. It is a valid question for our times as it was for past times: in our age it perhaps looks like this:-

What do you get out of it? Do you enjoy it? Is it profitable or would you be better engaged doing the garden, taking the dog for a walk or the children to football/cricket/orchestra ...?

Let us first dismiss the old canard that if you don't go to church you'll finish up in hell. For some sects it might be close to what they claim, but for this writer I can't see that God is going to judge anyone on that criterion.

So why go? At the very least to remind us of this truth; *‘if we try to use the material world as though it belongs to us, to use as we think fit, to serve our will, every single blessing in it will become a curse. From that terrible fact there is no escape for us either as individuals or as societies. No intellectual brilliance or perfection of organisation, no human scheming, however subtle, can enable us to subdue the world of things to our human will. We may appear to succeed for a while, but in the end we must fail and fail disastrously. We must fail because at the heart of things from the beginning to now is a purpose given by a rational creator: that purpose to do with self-sacrificing love’*. This [slightly adapted] was written by Studdert Kennedy, the War poet who, after the Great War became a social activist. He could see that, all across history, the human propensity is to be selfish, and whilst every invention in every age gives scope for selfish and unselfish use, humans always have and always will tend to use them to satisfy greed for money, land, power, possessions. Going to church, I hope, reminds us that we are creatures and not the creator – stewards and not owners of its treasures.

I cannot find the book to quote accurately, but I think in ‘Lucy's Child’ we are told that humans have an ability to deceive – not only others but ourselves. Part of that deception is “Thank heavens I'm not like that”, or “I'm just as good a Christian as those who go to church”. We go to church because we can see how easy it is to think we're good –by going week by week we are reminded of our shortcomings, most particularly by our contemplation of Him who died on the cross to show how far true love is really willing to go.

We recognise that we need to go because we are imperfect, because we recognise that human vanity and pride and self-deception tend to paper over our obvious flaws. And there is, particularly at the communion, an assurance of God's love and understanding of our frailty, and his promise of forgiveness and encouragement. And of course, we expose ourselves to his challenge – go out and be more loving this week.

A weekly pattern of going to church reminds us that we are not in charge and that we are sinful and need to try harder. We don't need to go to church to be good, and we are not good because we go to church – but it is an outward action that to my mind puts us in a better position to get the world in perspective.

The Church was lit by candles for both the Christmas services. Children from Helmingham School together with their parents swelled the congregation for the carol service and everybody enjoyed their singing which had been organised by Mrs Celland and her staff. Mark Trevitt conducted the service and lessons were read by members of the congregation. A good number stayed for mulled wine and mince pies and an opportunity to exchange season's greetings. Penny Wilkes conducted the Service on Christmas Eve.

Thanks again to Lord and Lady Tollemache for organising the Drinks Party at Helmingham Hall it was good to see a mix of familiar and new faces that came along to enjoy the evening. Money raised on the evening for church funds thanks to all who supported the event.

All age service will be held at Helmingham Church on Sunday March 2nd.

Annual Church Meeting will be on Monday March 3rd

We are still collecting scrap metal for Church Funds but because of the new licensing arrangements some research is being carried out as to what is needed for collection for charity opposed to a business. Hopefully we will be able to soon let the people who kindly save metal for us know when we can start collecting again.

PETTAUGH

Christmas was celebrated in St Catherine's church with a candle-lit Carol Service on Sunday 22nd December. Carols, traditional and modern, were sung and there were readings again both traditional and modern. The congregation, which filled the church, joined in the carols and we were delighted that Anna from Debenham sang a solo and led the singing. A large congregation attended Communion Service which was held on Christmas morning. The storms over the Christmas and New Year caused some damage in the village and we are pleased to see that Jan's village shop has now

been repaired. It continues to provide its ever-smiling and ever-helpful service to the village and passers-by. Some parishioners have been affected by the cold and flu virus, as well as other health problems. We wish them a speedy recovery to health. Further work was done to enhance the Garden of Remembrance by the planting of a box-hedge around the perimeter. The box plants should eventually grow into the stainless mesh rabbit-proof fence and hide it completely. It is planned to replace the temporary gate to the Garden of Remembrance with a rabbit-proof oak gate in the next few months. Two saplings, an oak and a crab apple, donated by the Parish Council from the surplus public donations to celebrate the Queen's Golden Jubilee 'Big Lunch', have now been planted in the church meadow. The tree planting has been commemorated with a plaque mounted on a sturdy oak post, donated by a kind donor. We thank those who have done all this work to enhance our community surroundings. We extend a warm welcome to Natalie and Jemma who have moved into Pettaugh and we hope they have a happy time in our community. Although the dark mornings and afternoons of winter are now thankfully nearly over, we would like to remind all parishioners of the importance of wearing visible clothing when walking in the village. For their own safety, pedestrians should walk on the same side as, and facing, approaching traffic and be prepared to step off the roadway onto the verge. Motorists should be aware that herds of deer are on the loose in our parish, and in surrounding parishes, and drive with due care. The 'Pancake Lunch', which now seems to have become a traditional fixture, is planned for Saturday 1st March. Numbers will have to be limited to 40. A flyer will be delivered nearer the time with details. The Annual Church meeting will be held on Monday 28th April at 7 pm in the church.

WINSTON

We shall be holding another "Litter Pick" event. The more the merrier!! Last year we gathered an astonishing amount of various debris (some of an indescribable nature). We don't have a specific date yet, probably a Saturday in April. Please keep an eye out for notices on Board in Winston Green, Church, etc.

The Parish Council have decided to re-blacken the commemoration wording and names of the dead on our War Memorial. We thought that this would be appropriate in the 100 year anniversary of The First World War.

The Parish Council have been working for over a year to try to get the authorities (Police and Suffolk County Council) to do something to reduce the speed of traffic going through Winston and Winston Green. It's not been easy!! To cut a long story short, there seems to be no way that the current 40mph limits on either of our roads (Debenham Road in Winston Green and Fenn Street in Winston) can be reduced to

30mph, mainly due to 1. Insufficient density of housing 2. Not enough accidents!! and 3. Costs too much. However, in Fenn Street, with the active support of our new Suffolk County Councillor, Matthew Hicks, some engineering changes have been proposed and SCC can afford to fund them. Essentially these are to re-instate the Rumble Strips and do some alterations to the white-lining to give the perception of road narrowing and therefore heighten drivers' caution and reduce their speed. Since the latter will be contentious, the Parish Council will be consulting with Fenn Street residents before deciding how to proceed. The Suffolk Constabulary have not been as helpful. Consequently I have invited Tim Passmore, the Suffolk Police Commissioner, to our next Meeting (our AGM, everyone invited!) in May to explain why we never have any enforcement by the Police of our speed limits. No response to invitation as yet.

Other News and events.

Helmingham School News

Since the last time I wrote a lot has happened. Most significantly we were visited by Ofsted in September 2013. We were delighted to be judged as a good school and everyone involved in the school should be very proud.

Again we have been disappointed with the decision of the local authority not to extend our school. However we have moved forward with other improvements. The long awaited gazebo was erected in the summer and is now an integral part of our school. It is used during lessons and as part of break time, and at Christmas Santa discovered it! We are now putting in more facilities for those who cycle to school and have already created an outdoor play area for the younger children. The children continue to work hard and achieve well compared to national averages, they are enjoying a curriculum that taps in to their interests. The children have enjoyed visits to Christchurch Park, Fitzwilliam Museum, Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts and West Stow. The children in the oldest class staged amazing gallery based on the works of local artists and there has been an author visit. Our sports teams have got off to a great start reaching the semi-final of the football tournament.

Visitors are welcome in school and we would love members of the local community to come in to talk about their jobs and knowledge of our community. If you are interested in doing this please contact the school.

The Old School House Nursery

The Old School House Nursery, Helmingham, children rounded off the term with a super Nativity Play at the Framsdon Baptist Church. With shepherds gathering under the sheep in the meadow backdrop, angels with wings and the three kings all holding gifts for baby Jesus wrapped in Christmas Spiderman paper, certainly got all parents, friends and relatives in the festive mood. Wonderful singing and playing of instruments rounded off the event. Quickly following this was our traditional Christmas Party held at The Coach House, Helmingham Hall with Kev organising

games and disco – Santa visited and all the children received presents. We kick off 2014 looking at ‘ALL ABOUT ME’. Each week building on to their interests from their home, garden, pets, toys, family, how they see themselves. We welcome four new children and look forward to meeting their families and friends. Numbers are featuring in our weekly circle time with action songs like ‘5 little ducks went swimming one day’. Our nursery is all about choices and we will be asking the children what colour playdough to make on our return, where they want to be as we offer free-flow play during the day. Our waterproofs will be out in force if the rain comes down and should we get snow, you can bet we will be out in the garden on our toboggans whizzing down the hill – a real favourite of the children. Later in the term we will be considering all things to do with my home and garden – building a display in nursery to show who lives there and what we see in our garden. Chinese New Year is always a must at our Nursery as we have a large Dragon Head to do our own dancing as well as our role play area having traditional Chinese clothing; we practice using chopsticks and write with black strokes in ink. This year is the year of the Horse so the hobby horses will be out around the garden. Woodwork was a popular introduction at the end of last term so we are hoping to build on this in the New Year with sessions, although the hammering of nails is very enthusiastic. 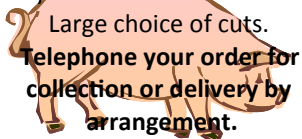

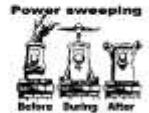
