## Gift Aid

The churches in the benefice are concerned that we do not make the most of gift aid to maximise our income. If you pay tax, the amount of any money you give to the church in donations can be increased, at no cost to you, by gift aiding it. If you gift aid £4 we can reclaim another £1 from HMRC making your donation worth £5. You can gift aid an amount of money up to the amount of tax you pay.

What should you do?

- There are gift aid envelopes in some churches that have a form to fill in for one-off donations. Other churches will be getting a supply of these, please ask.
- If you give a regular amount through an envelope scheme at your church and you pay tax you should fill in a gift aid form if you haven't already done so. Stocks of these are available in church. Those churches that do not operate an envelope scheme may do so shortly. Please ask your church treasurer or warden.
- If you donate or buy anything for the church but do not claim the money i.e. giving a raffle prize or baking a cake for a cake stall we can reclaim gift aid on these amounts as well provided you have filled in a gift aid form. You only need to fill in the form once for any future donations to be gift aided. You must present a receipt for what you have purchased or, in the case of a cake donation, a note of the cost of the ingredients for the cake. This latter may take a bit of working out but over a year, if everyone does it, can make a huge difference to our income. Give any receipts or notes to your churchwarden or treasurer.

Please help us to increase our income, it will be the government that pays extra not you. Please contact your warden or treasurer for further information.

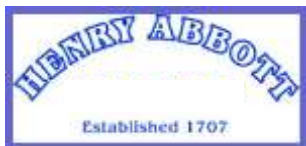

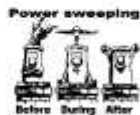
