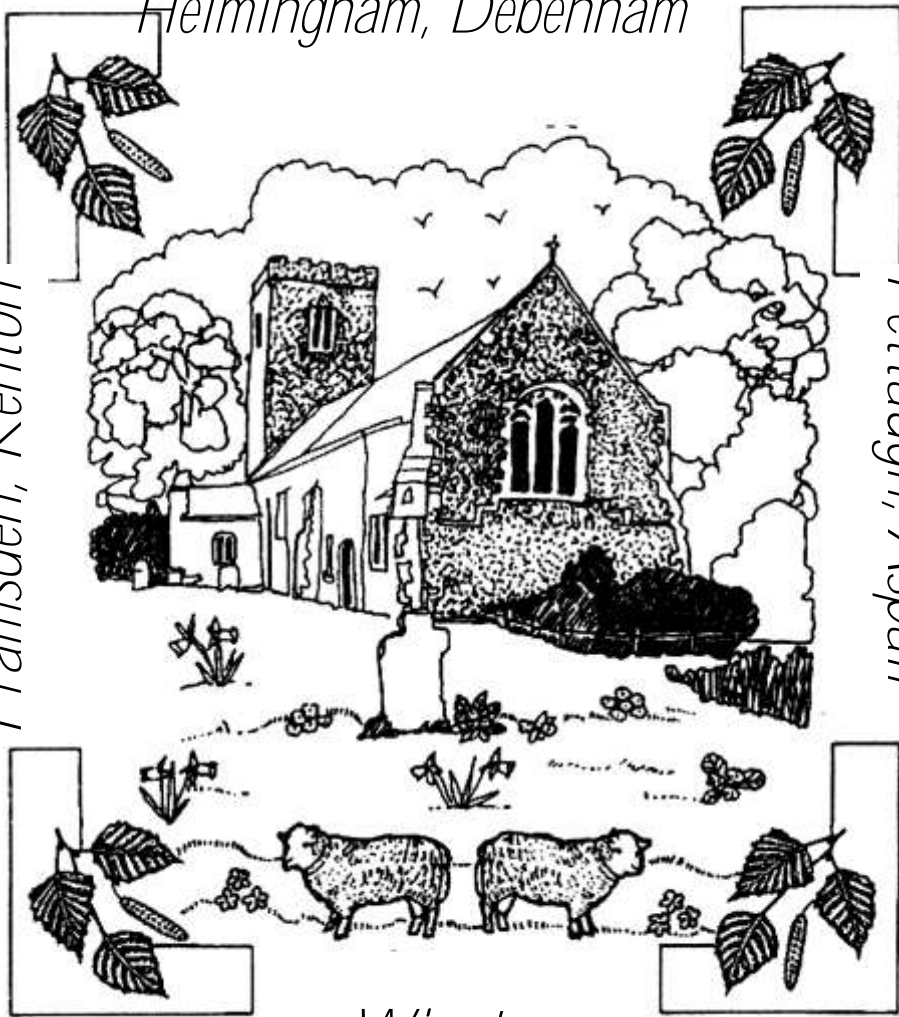

## Spring 2017

In the church calendar we have been through one period of waiting and preparation – Advent; and we are approaching (or in, depending on the date you are reading this) another period, waiting to celebrate Easter. Spring is the time that nature is waiting as plants wait for the right conditions to grow and produce leaves and flowers, and birds wait for warmer weather and a supply of insects before building their nests.

We recognise the excellent work our ministry team and visiting priests are doing to maintain our worshipping communities but we are also waiting, waiting for a new priest to lead us. In April 2016, we were told that we could have a new rector in post by this Easter; that now seems unlikely and, at the time of writing, there seems to be no interest in our vacancy. As Christians we are people of hope, so let us hope that it will not be too long before somebody realises what a great place this could be in which to live and work.

But America has a new leader; this will be old news by the time you read it but Donald Trump is going to make America great again! What does greatness mean? Right-clicking on the word in my word processor reveals synonyms – magnitude; enormity; immensity, vastness; size; importance; prominence; seriousness. I wonder which of these are in Donald's mind when he talks of greatness.

Do we want a new rector who will make our benefice great? Well perhaps...

Some quotations on the theme of greatness:

*Not everybody can be famous but everybody can be great, because greatness is determined by service* (Martin Luther King Jnr)

If we replace 'body' with 'benefice' that would fit our Christian calling.

I like this quote from Thomas Merton

*I believe that the first test of a great man is his humility. I don't mean by humility, doubt of his power. But really great men have a curious feeling that the greatness is not of them, but through them. And they see something divine in every other man and are endlessly, foolishly, incredibly merciful.*

*Our Christian destiny is, in fact, a great one: but we cannot achieve greatness unless we lose all interest in being great. For our own idea of greatness is illusory, and if we pay too much attention to it we will be lured out of the peace and stability of the being God gave us, and seek to live in a myth we have created for ourselves. And when we are truly ourselves we lose most of the futile self-consciousness that keeps us constantly comparing ourselves with others in order to see how big we are.*

I'm not sure that is the sort of greatness Trump has in mind. Nor this from Ralph Waldo Emerson:

*A great man is always willing to be little*

Nor this from Calvin Coolidge the 30th president of the USA:

*It takes a great man to be a good listener*

Perhaps the next two quotes illustrate some of the qualities we need in a rector:

*A man's greatness is neither determined by having great dreams nor by his determination to realize them; but by his contribution—however small it may be—to the progression of humanity* (Mehmet Murat ildan)

*You want to be great? Help others achieve their greatness* (Bangambiki Habyarimana, *Pearls Of Eternity*)

I hope I'm not setting the bar impossibly high for whoever comes by suggesting that they should be able to satisfy Abraham Lincoln.

*Abraham Lincoln was asked by an aide about the church service he had attended. Lincoln responded that the minister was inspired, interesting, well-prepared, eloquent and the topic relevant. The aide said, "Then it was a good service?" Lincoln responded, "No." The aide protested, "But, Mr. President, you said that the minister was inspired, interesting, well-prepared, eloquent, and that the topic was relevant."*

*"Yes," replied Lincoln, "but he didn't challenge us to do any great thing."*

## **Evening Prayer during the interregnum**

During the interregnum (i.e. until a new Parish Priest is appointed) Evening Prayer service at Debenham Parish Church continues on Wednesday evenings at 6pm. This will be a short, informal service, typically following the Common Worship format.

## **Vacancy**

The Benefice wardens are frustrated with the lack of progress in appointing a new Rector. We had the Benefice Profile (see [www.cofesuffolk.org/vacancies](http://www.cofesuffolk.org/vacancies)) ready in August but it was not put on the Diocesan website until December. We decided to advertise in the *Church Times* in January but Bishop Martin blocked this because some parishes had made no contribution towards their parish share. This has since been rectified but at the time of writing (31.01.17) I have not heard that the advert has been approved.

I gather that Bishop Martin is making personal approaches to people he thinks may be suitable to minister in our benefice but so far without success. The wardens will be meeting at the beginning of February to discuss the situation and to compose a letter to the Bishop to register their dissatisfaction with the lack of progress. Your local churchwarden will be kept up to date with developments as they occur so do ask them when you read this. Hopefully things will have moved forward by then.

## **PETTAUGH**

The address was given by Mark Trevitt who also took our Christmas morning Communion Service. church meadow which are regularly maintained in a neat state. Urgent work had to be undertaken by tree surgeons to deal with the diseased trees in the churchyard. The dropping of a large branch from a tree onto the public footpath made this work essential in order to ensure the safety of parishioners. The generous support of the Parish Council in maintaining our open space is greatly appreciated.

Extensive work has been carried out in 'Jan's shop' to refurbish the room and make it more comfortable for community use. Plans are in hand for some events in the next few months.

Please take note of the friendly **Marvellous Marmalade Competition** with a Coffee and Cake Sale to be held in Dove Cottage next to St Mary's Church in Debenham on **Saturday morning 11 March**. Please put the date in your diary. All proceeds are for St Catherine's funds. Parishioners are invited to submit entries of their marmalade for judging. Any variation using a citrus fruit, alone or in combination, is eligible for entry. There is no charge for entering the competition and a rosette will be awarded to the 'Best' in each of three categories (Seville Orange; Seville Orange with another Citrus fruit; Citrus fruit other than Seville Orange). Tea, coffee and cake will be available at reasonable prices to raise funds for St Catherine's Church, Pettaugh.

Anyone who wishes to enter the competition should bring their 454 g (1 lb) jar of marmalade to Dove Cottage between 9 and 9.30 am with their name on a small piece of paper to be placed underneath the bottle on the table provided. You may enter one jar in any or all of the three categories and the jar should be labelled with the category and type of citrus fruit it contains. Entries will be judged on taste and flavour between 9.30 and 10 am.

## **The Old School House Nursery**

The children of The Old School House Nursery had much excitement when the local Firemen came to the school next door and we were invited to join them. Being able to sit in the cab and listen to the siren was very popular but more so was the hose at full force in the playground. There was the chance to try on some of the clothing and equipment with boots that came up to some of the younger children's waist! Lots of squeals of delight and enthusiasm telling parents when being picked up.

We are now well into the term which is all about Vegetables and Fruit – linking this with the colours to add to the learning of the children. An improvised shop with till and brown paper bags is well used by the children as they bag up the potatoes and carry them off. We just hope we find them all at the end of the day... Some turned up in the doll's pram under the covers the other day!

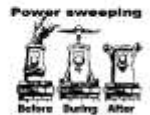

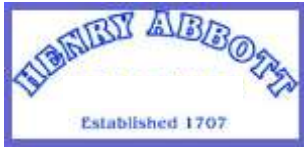
